Internship Length

The internship length varies from 1 to 6 months, or even longer.

Internship Stipends

One thing that the applicants need to be aware of is this program is made to provide people with opportunities to experience, learn and grow for a future in a global society, instead of



opportunities to make money.

Most of our internships are paid with certain amount of stipend which could help financially aid their expenses in China. The amount of stipend depends on the nature of position and industry, internship duration, and applicant's qualifications. Generally speaking, the stipend for an internship less than 2 months could be very little or even none. For a 3-month internship, the stipend could be about RMB 1500 Yuan (i.e. \$220 USD) per month. For a 4-6 month internship, the stipend could be about RMB 2500 Yuan (i.e. \$370 USD) per month. The short period of medical, finance, law internships would usually be non-paid, while the stipend for the long hospitality and English teaching internships being relatively higher. For example, a 6-month internship with a hotel would usually provide a free accommodation besides a minimum stipend RMB2000 (approx. \$308 USD) per moth. Eligibility Requirements for Applicants

- Proficiency in English speaking and writing.
- University student (undergraduate/postgraduate), graduate, young professional.
- Motivation to experience and learn, instead of making money.
- Being covered by International travel and medical insurance.
- Observance of the program and internship company rules.

Inclusive Program Fee: RMB 7345 Yuan (or \$1130 USD when 1 USD is 6.50 RMB)

The program fee is fixed on RMB7345 Yuan (or \$1130 USD when 1 USD is 6.5 RMB), which includes Internship Placement, Visa Assistance, Housing Arrangement Assistance, Airport Pick-up, Orientation, Convenience Package, Residence Registration Assistance, Internship Mentor Arrangement, 8-hour Chinese Mandarin Lesson, Networking and Events-organizing, Internship Certificate, and 24/7 Emergency Support. The program deposit RMB 1224 Yuan (i.e. \$188 USD) needs to be paid upfront in order to get enrolled. The rest of program fee RMB6121 (approx. \$942 USD) should be paid when the internship position has been arranged successfully and the official invitation letter sponsored by the host internship company has been issued. Surely, RMB 650 (approx. \$100 USD) of the program deposit will be refundable if UOutlook fails to provide the participant with an internship of interest within 45 working days and the participant is not willing to wait any longer. However, if the participant does not take the internship offer which fits to the participant's requirement, the program deposit will not be refundable.

What's Included

The program fee is fixed on RMB7345 Yuan (or \$1130 USD when 1 USD is 6.50 RMB), which includes Internship Placement, Visa Document Support, Housing Arrangement Assistance, Airport Pick-up, Orientation, Convenience Package, Residence Registration Assistance, Internship Mentor Arrangement, 8-hour Chinese Mandarin Lesson, Networking and Events-organizing, Internship Certificate, and 24/7 Emergency Support.

- **Internship Placement**

A suitable internship placement which correlates to the participant's interest and background will be guaranteed prior to their arrival.

- **Visa Document Support**

The participant is supposed to hold a Business F visa to carry out their internship in China. The valid duration for F visa goes from a month up to 6 months. UOutlook will assist in providing the required documents (e.g. an invitation letter sponsored by the internship host company) for the participants to sort out their visa into China. The details about the visa application process could be seen on the website of Chinese embassy in the country where the participant applies for the visa.

- **Housing Arrangement Assistance**

Based upon the request, UOutlook will provide the participants with assistance in searching, locating and arranging the accommodation according to their budget and

requirements. The accommodation and related fee is not included in the internship program fee. Usually, this arrangement process will not start till the internship position has been successfully arranged and confirmed. By doing this, UOutlook could make sure the accommodation will be reasonably closed to their internship place. The accommodation detailed information including the fee, location, surrounding transport and environment plus the photos would be given to the participants to help them make a well-informed decision before their arrival in China.

Given the facts that different participant has different budget, habit and requirement on their living, and that the accommodation fee varies from the factors such as location, interior decoration, and equipment, UOutlook generally divides the accommodation into a few options (A/B/C) for every participant to choose. UOutlook will then arrange according to their choice. Please note the utility bills are usually not included in the rent. It works on the "Pay As You Go" basis. The rent payments are due upon arrival in China. The accommodation requires a damage deposit equal to one month's rent by the landlords. The deposit will be returned if the signed rent lease has been fully completed and there is no damage beyond normal wear and tear.

A. RMB 2000-3000 Yuan (approx. \$308-462 USD) per month

Furnished single bedroom at a shared apartment with air conditioner, Internet access, washing machine, basic furniture (e.g. bed, table, chair, clothes wardrobe) and shared bathroom

B. RMB 3000- 4000 Yuan (approx. \$462-616 USD) per month

Furnished single bedroom with an independent bathroom at a shared apartment (or a one-bedroom independent apartment) with air-conditioner, Internet access, basic furniture (e.g. bed, table, chair, clothes wardrobe).

C. More than RMB 4000 Yuan (approx. \$616 USD) per month

Luxuriously Furnished single bedroom with an independent bathroom at a shared

apartment (or a one-bedroom independent apartment) with air-conditioner, Internet access, basic furniture (e.g. bed, table, chair, clothes wardrobe).

D. Homestay (affordable & culture-immersed)

UOutlook will arrange a local family or young professional to provide a free-of-charge accommodation for the participant. The young professional host or at least a person from the host family is able to speak English. The provided accommodation will be a decent single bedroom with air-con and internet access. The Homestay program fee is not included in the internship program fee. It varies from the length of Homestay.

- One month Homestay, the program fee is RMB 2200 Yuan (approx. \$340 USD)
- Two-month Homestay, the program fee is RMB 4000 Yuan (approx. \$616 USD)
- Three-month Homestay, the program fee is RMB 5400 Yuan (approx. \$832 USD)
- Four-month Homestay, the program fee is RMB 6400 Yuan (approx. \$986 USD)
- Five-month Homestay, the program fee is RMB 8000 Yuan (approx. \$1233 USD)
- Six-month Homestay, the program fee is RMB 9600 Yuan (approx. \$1479 USD)

- **Airport Pick-up**

according to the flight and arrival information provided by the participants, UOutlook will arrange the staff to meet them at the airport, and escort them to their residence.

- **Orientation**

UOutlook's Orientation promises to be a pragmatic one. UOutlook will arrange the staff to show the participants around the place where they are going to stay, help them get familiar with the surrounding environment, show them how to use the public transport system, how to make a local and international phone call, remind them of the things which they need to be aware of while living and working in China, and introduce them to their internship company and mentor on the first visit.

- **Convenience Package**

to help the participants settle down in a more comfortable and efficient manner, UOutlook provides them a comprehensive & user-friendly convenience package, which includes a bedding packet, a new cell phone with a local SIM card with RMB 50 Yuan pre-paid money, an international phone card with RMB 100 Yuan value, transport card (versatile for subway, bus and taxi) with RMB 30 Yuan pre-paid money, an English tourist map.

- **Residence Registration Assistance**

according to the Chinese law, the participants are supposed to register their temporary residence at a corresponding local police station within 24 hours of their arrival in China. UOutlook will assist every participant with this registration process.

- **Internship Mentor arrangement**

to help the participants have a quality internship experience, UOutlook ensures a professional will be assigned by the internship company to work as their supervisor and mentor at work.

- **8-hour Chinese Mandarin Introductory Lesson**

UOutlook provides the participants with an 8-hour one-on-one customized Chinese mandarin Lesson to help them have a good start on learning Chinese and acquire basic

survival ability in the language. The Lesson can be conducted in a week prior to their internship. It can also be conducted at night or on the weekend during their internship.

- **Networking and Events-organizing**

to help the participants make the most out of their stay during the internship, UOutlook will help organize them to know each other, provide them with the opportunities of networking and attending the various events and conferences. Any fee related to the networking or events is not included in the internship program fee.

- **Internship Certificate**

Internship Certificate will be awarded to the participants upon their successful completion of internship by UOutlook and Internship Company.

- **24/7 Emergency Support**

UOutlook provides every participant with 24/7 emergency support.

When to Apply

The start dates for this program are flexible. Application is accepted all year round. The internship placement generally takes 4 to 6 weeks to finalize. Plus the time it takes for the participant to process the visa and flight ticket, and for UOutlook to arrange the accommodation, we would suggest the applicants to submit their application at least 2 months ahead of the time they plan on arriving in China. But as always, we would like to welcome the applicant to apply and get enrolled as early as they can, especially during the busy periods like from April to June and from October to January. Please note the hiring companies will not accept new interns from February 1st to 20th 2011 in observance of Chinese New Year (also known as Spring Festival) holiday.

How to Apply & How It Works

Step 1 – application

Download *the Application Form for Internship in China* from the UOutlook's website

<http://www.uoutlook.com/Application.asp>, fill it out and email it to info@uoutlook.com or uoutlook@yahoo.cn, with your up-to-date **resume in Word format**, a **formal photo** which needs to be presented to the prospective hiring companies, and **preferably** a motivation letter and scanned copy of your passport.

Step 2 – perusing

The UOutlook’s program specialist will peruse your application materials, and get back to you if you are eligible for this program within 5 working days.

Step 3 – getting enrolled

If you are eligible, UOutlook will ask you to pay the program deposit RMB1224 Yuan (approx. \$188 USD). After receiving the applicant’s deposit, UOutlook will put you on the participate list, start the internship arrangement process, and keep you updated.

Step 4 – arrangement process

The UOutlook’s Internship Placement Specialist will start by searching the database to see if there is any available placement which fits to your interest and background. If so, the detailed information will be given to you for your consideration. If no, our specialists will develop a suitable placement soon. Meanwhile, you can also see by yourself if there is any suitable placement on the *Internship Opportunities* section of UOutlook’s website www.uoutlook.com. To help the interested company decide on your employment, an interview by phone or Internet will be conducted if needed.

Step 5 – visa, payment, & flight

After internship placement and company has been successfully arranged, UOutlook will email you an Invitation Letter sponsored by the internship company, which you can use to apply for a business F visa to China. Meanwhile, the rest of program fee RMB 6121 Yuan (i.e. \$900 USD) should be paid. After getting a visa, you will purchase the flight ticket, and tell us your flight and itinerary information, which we need to arrange the airport pick-up.

Step 6 – accommodation, airport pickup, settling...

UOutlook will start arranging the accommodation for you according to your arrival time. It usually takes about a week to process. UOutlook will email you the accommodation information for you to make decision. UOutlook will also arrange someone to meet you up at the airport and escort you to the pre-arranged residence.

Step 7 – Orientation & internship kick-off & ongoing support...

UOutlook will arrange the staff to show you around the place where they are going to stay, help you get familiar with the surrounding environment, show you how to use the public transport system, how to make a local and international phone call, remind you of the things which they need to be aware of while living and working in China, and introduce you to your internship company and mentor on the first visit.

Step 8 – ongoing support...

- About the program deposit

Surely, RMB 650 Yuan (approx. \$100 USD) of the program deposit fee RMB 1224 Yuan

(\$188 USD) will be refundable if we fail to find you an internship within 45 working days, and you are not willing to keep waiting any longer. However, if you don't take the internship after we manage to find a placement fit to your requirements, the deposit fee is non-refundable.

- About the internship placement

The placement will be arranged according to the participant's interest and qualification.

Living Expenses In China

Given the fact that different people have different habits and styles on spending, it is very difficult to say how much exactly it is going to cost to live in China. For your reference, we will take living in Shanghai city as an example to specify.

Firstly, **as for the accommodation**, for a shared or one-bedroom independent apartment, the rent generally ranges from \$300-600 USD per month. It could be more or less depending on such factors as location, interior decoration and equipments, etc. **As for the transport**, it is easy and convenient to get around the city by the public transport system. It costs 2 Yuan (about \$0.3 USD) to take a bus for a single trip. For subway, it varies from 3 Yuan (about \$0.45 USD) to 9 Yuan (about \$1.35 USD) per single trip depending on how far you travel. **As for the meal**, it costs about 10-20 Yuan (about \$1.5-3 USD) to have an ordinary meal set. **As for the entertainment or social events**, it varies from bar to bar, club to club. Generally, many clubs ask for an entry admission say 100 Yuan (about \$15.4 USD). Then a small bottle of beer could cost about 40 Yuan (about \$6.2 USD). **As for travel**, if you are traveling from Shanghai to Nanjing, a capital city of Jiangsu province, you can take an inter-city express train which costs 146 Yuan (about \$22.5 USD) for about 1.5 hours. If you travel to Beijing by the train, it takes about 10 hours and costs 327 Yuan (about \$50 USD). If you take a plane, it takes about 2.5 hours and costs about 1200 Yuan (about \$185 USD).

Please **note** all the above-given prices do not necessarily represent the actual prices. The real

prices are decided by the market, and subject to the change. We present them for your information only.

About Visa to China

The participant needs to get a business F visa in order to carry out an internship in China. They could apply for it themselves at the Chinese embassy or general consulate in the countries where they are from or staying at the moment. They could also do it through the visa agencies. UOutlook will support the participant's visa process by providing the needed document or paper they are not able to provide. After the application has been successfully taken, it usually takes about 4 working days to process the visa. All the details about the required application materials, where and how to apply can be seen on the websites of Chinese embassies in their countries. Please note the visa fee is not included in the program fee.
