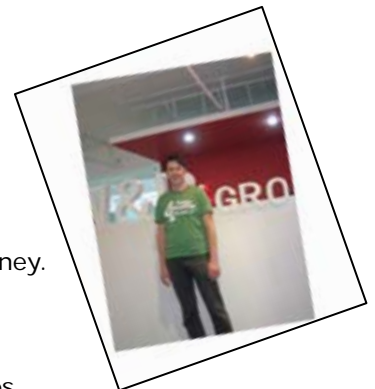

 The internship search and arrangement process will be based upon your interests and academic & professional backgrounds. A placement of interest will be pre-guaranteed prior to your arrival.
- Potential Monthly internship allowance
 Most of internships will be paid on a monthly basis with a certain amount of internship

allowance which helps offset your daily expenses, but not guaranteed.

- Visa application & extension support

We will assist you in getting the required documents and guide you through the visa application process. The documents will be sent to you at least a few weeks ahead of your planned arrival time so you will have enough time to process and obtain a Business F visa in the country of your residence. More information can be seen on the website of Chinese embassy in the country where you apply for the visa. In addition, if your visa needs to be extended to complete your internship, we will assist and guide you through the visa extension process. All the visa-related fees are not included in the program fee.

- Housing arrangement assistance

If requested, we will provide you with assistance in searching, locating, and arranging you an accommodation based upon the internship location. Your housing budget will be taken into account during the process. All the housing-related fees are excluded from the program fee.

- Airport pick-up

According to your flight and arrival information, our UOutlook team member will meet you at the airport and escort you to the place where you are going to stay.

- Orientation

Our orientation will be a pragmatic one. When to Apply

The start dates for this program are flexible. Your application is accepted all year round. Since it usually takes about 4-6 weeks for us to place you an internship of interest, plus the time you need to process your visa, flight ticket and departure preparation, we would suggest you to submit your application at least 2 months ahead of the time you are planning on arriving in China. But as always, we would like to welcome you to apply and get enrolled as early as you can, especially during the busy periods like from April to June and from October to January.



How to Apply & How It Works

Step 1 – applying

Download *the Application Form for Internship in China* from our website <http://www.uoutlook.com/Application.asp>, fill it out and email it to info@uoutlook.com or uoutlook@yahoo.cn, with your up-to-date *resume in Word (.doc) format*, *a formal photo* which needs to be presented to the prospective internship hiring companies, and *preferably a motivation letter* stating the reason why you'd like partake in our program and what you hope to achieve and *a scanned copy of your passport*.

Step 2 – perusing

Our application specialist will peruse your application materials, and get back to you whether or not you are eligible for this program in less than 5 days. Your email may not be received if you do not hear from us.

Step 3 – getting enrolled

If you are eligible, the program deposit USD \$200 needs to be paid upfront to get yourself enrolled. After your deposit has been received, our internship placement team will start finding and arranging you an internship based upon your interest and qualifications.

Step 4 – searching & arranging

our placement team will start the process by searching the internship database to see if there is any available placement which fits to your interest and background. If so, the detailed information will be given to you right away for your consideration. If no, our specialists will find you a suitable placement as soon as possible. Meanwhile, you can also see by yourself if there is any suitable placement on the *Internship Opportunities* section of our site www.uoutlook.com. To help the interested company decide on your employment, an interview by phone or Internet (e.g. Skype) might be arranged and conducted.

Step 5 – visa, payment, & flight

After your internship placement and company have been successfully arranged, we will email you an Invitation Letter sponsored by the internship company, which you can use to apply for a business F visa to China. After getting the visa, you can purchase the flight ticket, and tell us your flight and itinerary information, which we need to arrange your airport pick-up. Meanwhile, the remaining program fee should be paid.

Step 6 – accommodation, airport pickup, settling down...

We will start arranging the accommodation for you according to your arrival time. It usually takes about a week to process. The accommodation details (incl. descriptions and photos) will be sent to you prior to your arrival. Our staff will meet you up at the airport and escort you to the pre-arranged residence.

Step 7 – Orientation & internship kick-off & continual support...

We will arrange our staff to show you around the place where they are going to stay, help you get familiar with the surrounding environment, show you how to use the public transport system, how to make a local and international phone call, remind you of the things which they need to be aware of while living and working in China, and introduce you to your internship company and mentor on the first day of your visit.

Our Guarantee & Refund Policy

The placement will be searched and arranged based upon your interests and qualifications. Moreover, you get to decide whether or not you will take the provided internship option. USD \$120 of the deposit (USD \$200) you paid upfront will be refunded if we fail to provide you any internship option which suits to your interests and requirements ultimately.

Living Expenses In China

Given the fact that different people have different habits and styles on spending, it is very difficult to say how much exactly it is going to cost to live in China. For your reference, we will take living in Shanghai city as an example to specify.

Firstly, **as for the accommodation**, for a shared or one-bedroom independent apartment, the rent generally ranges from USD \$450-1000 per month. It could be more or less depending on such factors as location, interior decoration and equipments, etc. **As for the transport**, it is easy and convenient to get around the city by the public transport system. It costs 2 Yuan (about \$0.32 USD) to take a bus for a single trip. For subway, it varies from 3 Yuan (about \$0.50 USD) to 9 Yuan (about \$1.4 USD) per single trip depending on how far you travel. **As for the meal**, it costs about 15-30 Yuan (about \$2.5-5 USD) to have an ordinary meal set. **As for the entertainment or social events**, it varies from bar to bar, club to club. Generally, many clubs ask for an entry admission say 100 Yuan (about \$15.4 USD). Then a small bottle of beer could cost about 40 Yuan (about \$6.2 USD). **As for travel**, if you are

traveling from Shanghai to Nanjing, a capital city of Jiangsu province, you can take an inter-city express train which costs 146 Yuan (about \$23 USD) for about 1.5 hours. If you travel to Beijing by the train, it takes about 10 hours and costs 327 Yuan (about \$52 USD). If you take a plane, it takes about 2.5 hours and costs about 1200 Yuan (about \$190 USD).

Please **note** all the above-given prices do not necessarily represent the actual prices. The real prices are decided by the market, and subject to the change. We present them for your information only.

About Visa to China

The participant needs to get a business F visa in order to carry out an internship in China. You apply for it at the Chinese embassy or general consulate in the countries where you are from or staying at the moment. You could also do it through the visa agencies. We will support your visa process by providing the needed documents or papers you are not able to provide. After the application has been successfully taken, it usually takes about 4 working days to process the visa. All the details about the required application materials, where and how to apply can be seen on the websites of Chinese embassies in the country where you are going to process your visa. Please note the visa fee is not included in the program fee.
